

**Callaway County Ambulance District (CCAD) Paramedic program
to William Woods University**

William Woods University will accept 28 hours of university academic credit as outlined below to individuals who graduate from the Callaway County Ambulance District (CCAD) Paramedic program after February 1, 2012. Individuals will need to complete the CCAD program and earn the certificate to be eligible for the transfer credit.

Students seeking this transfer credit will:

1. Provide WWU with documentation from CCAD that verifies program completion. WWU reserves the right to verify documentation it receives with CCAD.
2. Need to be admitted to WWU as a full-time or part-time student to receive the credit.

A list of remaining 8 - courses for students who have completed the CCAD Paramedic program follows. 8 - courses are designated in the WWU catalog by single-letter designations following the course title. Those designations are listed below in parenthesis next to the categories. A general category description is beneath the category names. The credits required in each category are on the right.

Communication ("C")

ENG101 English Composition I 3 cr
ENG102 English Composition II 3 cr

Creative and Aesthetic Sensibility ("A")

Typically a 100- or 200-level course in Art (ART), Music (MUS) or Theatre (THA) 3 cr
NOTE: Education majors must have three credits of ART or MUS.

Cultural Diversity ("D")

100- or 200-level courses throughout the university curriculum in language, geography, religion and culture 3 cr
NOTE: Elementary, Middle and Special Education majors must take Regions and Nations I (GEO201) or Regions and Nations II (GEO202).

NOTE 2: Students who qualify to begin a college foreign language at the II or higher level are considered to have met the Cultural Diversity requirement.

Historical Perspective ("H")

Typically a 100- or 200-level course in history (HIS) 6 cr

Mathematics ("M")

Typically a 100- or 200-level course with a MAT prefix.
NOTE: Elementary Education majors must take six credits of mathematics. Social Work majors are recommended to take Elementary Statistics (MAT114)

Meaning ("L")

Typically a 100- or 200-level English (ENG) course in literature or in film studies 3 cr

Social Science ("S")

Typically a 100- or 200-level course in Economics (ECN), Legal Studies (LGS), Psychology (PSY) or Sociology (SCA) 3 cr
NOTE: Education majors must take Macroeconomics (ECN251) or Microeconomics (ECN252) and Politics and Government (LGS105), a total of six credits. Social Work majors must take either General Psychology I (PSY101) or General Psychology II (PSY102) and SCA111, a total of six credits.

Value ("E")

100- or 200-level ethics courses throughout the curriculum, designated with an "E" at the end of the course title. 3 cr
