CLEAR SCHOLARS PROGRAM

William Woods University's Project CLEAR (Creating Leadership & Entrepreneurship Action and Response) Scholars Program, in conjunction with the Center for Leadership & Character, has been established to recruit students to WWU, cultivate leadership and entrepreneurial capacity, and address the economic and workforce challenges of Missouri. The Project CLEAR scholarship is designed to provide students with access to transformational educational opportunities through scholarship, programming, and experiences which will facilitate cultural, political, social and economic change in the local, state, and global arenas.

Students selected to be a part of the CLEAR Scholars program will **receive a \$12,000 scholarship** to be stacked with any academic merit award. This award is renewable for 3 additional years following the completion of their freshman year. Additionally, CLEAR Scholars will be required to complete the **Entrepreneurial Leadership & Change (ELC) Certificate program** - an undergraduate certificate composed of 4 classes focused on addressing global challenges, entrepreneurship and leadership foundations, community development, and solution development.

ELIGIBILITY & REQUIRED INFORMATION

To be eligible for the CLEAR Scholars program, students must meet the following requirements:

- 3.0 GPA
- Permanent Resident of Missouri (preference given to socially vulnerable communities)
- Must enroll in the ELC Certificate program
- Attend regular CLEAR Scholars meetings
- Participate in Project CLEAR activities

The scholarship is renewable for an additional 3 years given the following:

- Student remains in good academic standing (GPA does not fall below a 2.75)
- Student remains in good standing with WWU
- Student maintains active participation as described in the eligibility requirements

To be considered for the CLEAR Scholars Program, WWU asks that each student provide:

- A 1-2 page double-spaced essay identifying a local, state, national, or global issue and exploring the cultural, political, and social forces within these issues. Describe the impact on the affected community and why such issues need to be addressed. Specifically address how you (the student) are uniquely qualified to practice leadership within this context.
- A resume highlighting service-oriented activities.
- Completed application
