The program was revised this year which has led to a change in assessment processes. Further refinement of that process will be carried out as we sunset the older catalog courses and develop better assessment tools for the current program.

This program will not seek ACBSP accreditation so we need to consider the cost/benefit for continuing to utilize the Peregrine examination or creating a different form of evaluation testing for this program.

The program has not had a dedicated program manager for the past year which has limited time available to develop a robust assessment process. Of immediate concern was revising the program to eliminate issues in curriculum design, student requirements and an unmanageable "thesis" process, Now that these issues have been resolved, we are in a position to focus on best practices in assessment for this program.
